Manager's Report

Hello, everyone,

Fall is here and WOW, has it been busy at the park. A big "thank you" to all the volunteers and park staff who made Halloween in the Park such a great event. We estimated that on Friday night we had 4,000 people in attendance and on Saturday, 5,000 in attendance. Our only incident was that we ran out of parking spaces. Traffic was backed up past the first bridge on Route 216.. We finally managed to get everyone in and, boy, was it a great event. Great job, everyone!

The park staff has been very busy this fall working on many projects. Some of these are listed below:

 The sailboat launch ramp was extended. We extended the one ramp 6 feet with concrete when the lake level was down. Now it needs a

new courtesy dock.

2. We made hiking trail repairs. Both the MaryAnn Furnace Trail and the Laho Trail have had trails blazed, posts repaired, culverts fixed, and bridges built. Great job to the maintenance staff and Eagle Scouts in getting this work done.

3. Much needed repairs were made to the park gate and benches.

Park visitors have commented on how nice they look.

4. Pool repair work was done. Thank you, volunteers, for doing the heavy work at the pool cleanup. You were small in number, but mighty in work. The pool income this year was \$279,000. This figure is down from last year because of rainy weather.

5. A new garage maintenance lift was installed. Thanks to the Friends Group for funding the installation of this lift. The old garage lift was unsafe

for our workers.

Current Projects:

New windows in contact station.

2. New screens for the dressing rooms in the pool.

3. New deck and canopy for the classroom building.

4.On-going Mill House rehab.

Park Staff Update:

1. Most of our seasonal employees' last day will be November 8 th.

2. Our Assistant Manager, Vince Peterson, will be retiring mid

January.
3. Our DCNR Park Ranger, Ed Page, is currently in the Police Academy.

4. Lifeguard positions will be open next year, so please if you know anyone who wants to be a lifeguard at the park, send them to the park office and we will explain the application process.

Eagle Scout Project Update:

1. New stone steps for the Kayak Program are halfway done.

2. The MaryAnn Furnace and Laho Trail rehab work is done.

3. Clearing a walkway for fishermen at all 3 bridges is 1/3 done.

4. The turtle beach and turtle platform work is in the planning stage.

Wildlife Update:

1. 3 large muskie were caught this year, 45 inches, 51 inches, and 52 inches. It was reported that the 51 and 52 inchers were thrown back.

2. So far in archery season, it has been reported that 2 large buck have been taken. One was an 8 point and the other a 13 point buck.

3. We have been releasing ring-necked pheasants in the hunting

areas in the park.

 The Pennsylvania Fish Commission have stocked a lot of fish this season, muskie, walleye, channel catfish, and crappies.

Upcoming Events:

 The Veterans Memorial Program was canceled for this year. No tree planting took place.

In closing, I am very proud and humble to all of you who make Codorus a great state park. We had a big increase of local businesses and organizations helping with hayride displays, event support and donations. Thanks Suzie Landis, great job this year!





From Then .. To Now

Do you know that the Codorus Blast started as an Earth Day Celebration organized by the Park staff? This was done to highlight activities pertinent to the Park. Gradually over time the organizers changed, days were added, and activities changed. The one constant was the fact that people came to Codorus State Park to have a wonderful time.

The original choice for the celebration was Earth Day, a Saturday in April; this changed to May, for better weather, then finally to the current weekend in June, beginning early in 2002. The Codorus Summer Blast (original name) was first held on a Saturday, later Friday night was added, and finally the event grew to include

Sunday, which has continued to this day.

In 2001, Larry Rohrbaugh and Andy Alwine, of Scuba Team 49 of Penn Township, organized a one day event sponsored by WARM 103. The next year the sponsorship included WSBA. Music was a large part of the event, although 50 crafters and exhibitors also were there. Over the years sponsors changed, activities were added/subtracted, fireworks were added in 2002, and in 2007, the Friends Group, having been organized the previous year, began their involvement with the "Blast". Last year, 2013, the Friends of Codorus State Park took over the primary sponsorship and organization of the Codorus Blast.

The first "Blast", organized by the Park staff, was to showcase all the Park has to offer; to give people a wonderful day in a state park setting. However, due to its commercial sponsorship, the event became just that, more and more commercial. This coming year, the goal

for the Friends Group is to bring the Codorus Blast back to the its mission of promoting recreational and educational activities at Codorus State Park. Although the plans have yet to be finalized, the event will return to its roots, so to speak, and give attendees a wonderful time at a state park.



Friends of Codorus State Park presented Hanover Hospital with a check for \$2,500.00 as a donation toward the Medic 46 unit, for their service to Codorus State Park during the 2013 Blast and throughout the year. The money was part of the profit from the Blast.
