LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP
PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS

1. Lifetime membership in FOCSP can be achieved by several methods.
 - a. Life time membership for an individual who donated the appropriate monetary amount (\$250.00 or as updated at any future time by the Board of Directors) in a one-time donation or the amount donated in five annual payments which totals \$250.00.
 - b. Individual (not required to be a member of FOCSP) who has made a significant monetary donation (not less than \$250.00) or a significant donation of material goods greater in value of the monetary amount of a lifetime membership. Material(s) donation can be a one-time donation or a cumulative donation over a period of time. Individual must be recommended through completion of the form Lifetime Membership Recommendation and then approved by the Board of Directors at a regular monthly board meeting. (Note: Meeting must have a quorum of Board of Directors present.)
 - c. Individuals who have contributed significant time and efforts for FOCSP over an extended period of time. Also, members of FOCSP who have achieved 1000 hours of volunteer time may be considered for lifetime membership. (Note: Meeting must have a quorum of Board of Directors members present.)
2. Standards for lifetime membership
 - a. Payment of the \$250.00 donation satisfies the standard for lifetime membership for an individual.
 - b. Individual monetary or material donations will be evaluated by the Board of Directors.
 - c. Individual and/or member (1000 hours of volunteer time) who has contributed significant time and effort may have this category reviewed and decided upon by the Board of Directors.
3. Lifetime membership will be awarded at the time of achieving the standard and approved by the Board of Directors.

Revised procedure approved by the Board of Directors on September 17, 2015.

Every Sunday evening during the summer, Bob Larsen can be found by the Band Shell selling snacks for FOCSP. We thank him for his dedication for these concert events.

Our fire wood crew certainly puts in a lot of hard work, and many hours of dedication to make sure we have plenty of fire wood to sell to the campers. Thanks, guys and gals!

We joined with other local groups to purchase digital copies of Mary Ann Furnace Sales Ledgers from the 1700s, and to construct a replica of a Mary Ann Furnace stove. The stove is on display at the Visitor's Center.

FOCSP made donations to various community groups such as local fire departments and emergency groups, Hanover Hospital's Medic 46, Pleasant Hill, Penn Township, and Jefferson Fire Companies, York County Control, and York County Forest Fire Unit from profits made during our events.

Self-serve ice sales was added in the campground so campers can purchase ice even when the Outpost is not open.

In order to reduce costs and make mailings easier, we have begun offering the newsletter by email to interested members. So far, 23 members have agreed to receive the newsletter by email.

Gift Shop and Museum

We have around 10 volunteers. Our hours during summer were 12 pm to 5 pm, Wednesday through Saturday. Sunday hours were 1 pm to 5 pm. After Labor Day we went back to Friday thru Sunday. After camping season we will go to Saturday and Sunday. Store will close at the end of December until the second or third weekend in April.

We sell gifts, camp supplies, discs for disc golf, drinks, chips, candy and Codorus State Park clothing, pins, and patches, and for the Bald Eagle we have t-shirts, sweatshirts, and patches. Prints of the S.P. Markle store and CDs of how the park was made are also on sale. We also give out general information to people who are lost or just need information about the park.

Outpost Camp Store

The Outpost opened this year on April 10, 2015 and will be closing on October 31, 2015. This year, campers had access to ice and wood 24/7. This has been going well. The store provided camping items, snacks, drinks, and gift items. It has been a successful year. Thanks to all who volunteered at the Outpost Store. Sunday Concerts

From Memorial Day to Labor Day on Sunday evenings, we have a stand at the band shell selling drinks, chips, and candy to people coming to listen to the band concerts. We made it through 14 of the 15 concerts. The only cancellation was due to heat and not rain. We did have a shower come through once, but the band played on!

We took in \$536.60 in sales and \$67.96 in donations, for a total income of \$604.56. Expenses were \$266.84 so our total profit was \$337.72

Newsletter

The Friends of Codorus State Park publish a quarterly newsletter, the Friends Messenger. The purpose is to keep members apprised of upcoming events, as well as up to date on important events that have taken place at the park. Information is gathered from any member of the Friend's group who feels they have information that should be shared with the group.

Volunteers also help to fold the printed newsletters, and stuff into envelopes; then label and sort the envelopes.

Currently, the newsletter is sent to 231 households or businesses, and another 23 people receive it by email.

Gift Shop Renovations

A major project this year has been to make renovations and updates to the Gift Shop building, mainly in the downstairs area where the office, kitchen, storage closets, and board room are located. After incurring more water damage from heavy rains, mold abatement was done. To complete that process, the wallboard was removed. Once the building was declared free of mold, wiring was updated, new wallboard and ceiling tiles were installed, and replacement windows were added. There is still more work to be done: kitchen cabinets and shelving need to be completed, as well as flooring completed. Thanks to Ray Weleski for overseeing this project!

Park Programs

As part of our mission to assist in providing recreational and educational opportunities within the park, we supported other programs not organized by FOCSP, by providing funds and/or volunteers. Some of these programs included the Izaak Walton League's Youth Field Day, and the annual Duck Blind Drawing for which we provided refreshments. This generated a donation of \$700 for us. We also pay for bird seed to fill the feeders located in the park.

Dwight Resh is chairman of a recycling program within the campground, beginning with the Memorial Day weekend. Each of the 4 campground loops as well as the Outpost Camp Store has four totes located by the dumpsters. We are recycling metal and aluminum cans, glass jars, newspapers, magazines, and cardboard. Bob Larsen is assisting. All money from the sale of the cans is turned over to FOCSP. The goal is to keep everything out of the landfills and see it put to good use again.

Firewood sales at the Campground Outpost store has brought in over \$19,000 income this year! Wood sales at the self-serve shed have also been very successful. This is a major revenue-producer for us. The woodcutting crew meets approximately twice a week, year-round, to cut and split, and stack the wood that comes from within the park, or from nearby sources. Volunteers are always needed to help with this activity. All safety equipment (which is state-required) is provided for the volunteers.
