

Economic benefits

Hosted 37 million visitors who spent \$859 million (2010) on their trips

Managed 145 state parks concessions with total revenue to the bureau of \$2.2 million

Received S4 million Federal Highway Scenic Byway grant for new Laurel Highlands Falls Visitor Center at Ohiopyle

Generated S473,407 through agricultural and property leases, rights-of-way and our occupancy program, including seven new rights-of-way, two new agricultural leases, 14 property leases and 141 occupancy agreements

Sold out of campsites for the third consecutive year at Pymatuning's annual Halloween event, with more than \$30,000 in camping revenue from this volunteer-sponsored event

Growing services

Opened the new Kinzua Bridge observation deck in September



Created a pilot Dogs in Cabins program in seven parks

Constructed camping cottages at Black Moshannon for revenue generation

Installed over eight miles of some of the best mountain biking trail in the state at Nockamixon, working with International Mountain Biking Association-trained volunteers

Expanded hunting opportunities in three state parks

Finalized and bid Swatara's development plan

Opened the new Wildlife Center at Sinnemahoning in October, with temporary exhibits installed – permanent exhibits to be installed in 2013



Connecting to communities

Added three miles to the North Country
National Scenic Trail extension at Moraine with
volunteers, a particularly scenic section that
eliminated a mile of hazardous road walk



Completed part of a trail connector at Chapman to link to the Allegheny National Forest

Partnered with the Central PA Conservancy to open the Ironmasters Mansion at Pine Grove Furnace offering ovemight accommodations and program and special event space



Selected park improvements

Installed five new CXT restrooms at Parker Dam, Sand Bridge, Shikellamy, Cherry Springs and Sinnemahoning Rehabilitated 22 modern cabins at Moraine and Keystone



Completed Monongahela and Allegheny Wharf renovations at Point providing riverside access for walkers and bicyclists

Constructed new Pymatuning sewage treatment facility in partnership with Linesville Pine Joint Municipal Authority to reduce phosphate loading in the lake and assure the long term health of the main attraction for over three million visitors

Awarded concession contracts for food service at Point and innkeeping at Cook Forest

Extended the lease with the Appalachian Trail

Museum Society at Pine Grove Furnace to make
improvements to the mill building

Rehabilitated and electrified 10 campsites at Gifford Pinchot

Reblazed 20 miles of Prince Gallitzin trails

Rehabilitated Caledonia's pool and added a water slide

Installed new equine trailhead at Cowans Gap that connects to Buchanan State Forest

Replaced Laurel Highlands Hiking Trail bridge over the PA Turnpike, eliminating an eight-mile detour and reconnecting trails north and south of the highway

Expanded parking at Laurel Ridge cross country ski area, added new trails and installed high speed internet for web cam

Volunteers and friends

Volunteers... removed invasive species, rehabilitated trails, restored habitat, constructed trail boardwalks and bridges, blazed trails, pruned trees, picked up litter, created Facebook pages, monitored bluebird nest boxes, cleaned up streams, stocked fish, hosted events, collected donations, constructed duck next boxes, sponsored bluegrass concerts and bike races, purchased picnic tables,

groomed cross country ski trails, led kayak tours and much more!

Processed 598 letters of authorization, 146 special activities agreements, 106 radio repair authorizations, 76 commercial use licenses, 43 camp lease renewals, 14 property leases, 2 road use agreements, 5 memoranda of understanding, 3 coordination agreements, 2 agricultural leases, 1 sewer agreement, inspected 27 park concessions in 18 parks, answered 1,865 AskDCNR emails and 36 written letters and trained 1,713 employees via 36 training sessions!
